James Winston - I for one, do not wa t it rezoned; the map is fine like it is. Supervisor Lyon - The master plan has already rezoned that area, we

just have to make the maps legal.

Fran Rush - Is the industrial park why we are looking at a sewer district? Supervisor Lyon - It is part of it; the only way a sewer district can be done is to have it along with the industrial district project.

Main Street, Palmyra, NY, to consider the Establishment of Sewer District #1 of the Town of Palmyra, was called to order at 8:15 PM by Town Supervisor David C. Lyon.

Those present, in addition to the Town Board members, were the same as the two previous hearings.

Supervisor Lyon directed the Town Clerk, Beverly Hickman, to read the legal notice as published in the Courier-Journal.

James Winston - I do not want this.

Patti Diaz - What about hooking into this sewer system; is this a one-time charge and how much is it going to be? Supervisor Lyon - It is a one-time charge to actually hook into the sewer system, but, your taxes will show a sewer tax for as many years as it takes to pay for the line; the hook-up fee has not yet been determined. Robert Grier, Code Enforcement Officer, told her that the village charges \$1500, if that gave her an idea of the price range.

David Dzinbal - Does the charge go by how far away from the line you are and will it be mandatory that you hook up? Supervisor Lyon - What you pay a private contractor to hook in usually goes by how far away from the connection that you live; it will not be mandatory that you hook up, however, if you are in the district, you will pay a sewer tax whether or not you are hooked up.

A discussion of the petition that circulated followed. Many of those present insisted that they signed the petition only because they thought it meant the possibility of a sewer district was going to be looked into and then they (the residents) would decide if they really wanted it or not.

Lynne Green, Town Board Member - This was all brought about by people that want this to happen because they are having a septic problem; also a

sewer district could encourage a industrial area which would increase the tax base and lower our tax rates.

Robert Grier explained that this sewer line will not run along the road on Rt. 21, but will go in back of the residences on the east side of the road.

Gladys Henning asked if he meant in back of her property and Mr. Grier said yes.

Patti Diaz - Does the Town re-assess property because you are in a sewer district? Supervisor Lyon - The assessor does not follow projects around; when the neighboring houses sell for a higher price your property values will go up eventually.

Bob Henning - How many "yes's" before the other side of the road is included? Supervisor Lyon - when we receive a petition requesting a sewer line we will look into the possibility.

James Winston - If another petition is circulated and, for instance, 51 out of 100 people do not want this, could it be stopped? Supervisor Lyon - Possibly; but you have to remember that the whole idea is connected to a industrial area out there.

Patti Diaz - Our property values will decrease because of a industrial park whether we have a sewer district or not.

David Dzinbal - Along with industry comes a larger tax base to help keep my taxes down - With the possibility of growing industries out my way, why can't I be included in the sewer line too? Supervisor Lyon - The funding is only available because of the industrial park; not because of private residents that may want to be included.

Bob Henning - How soon will we know what is going to happen with this project? Supervisor Lyon - We will probable discuss this again and make a decision at the next board meeting which will be held on

Thursday, February 26, 1998.

A meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra was held at 201 East Main Street, in the Town of Palmyra on February 12, 1998, at 8:00 PM on the matter of the Establishment of Extension No. 3 to the Central Water District in the Town of Palmyra, pursuant to Article 12-A of the Town Law.

A map, plan and report relating to the establishment of a proposed Extension to the Central Water District, prepared by MRB Group, P.C., competent engineers, licensed by the State of New York, in the manner and detail required by the Town Board has been filed with the Town Clerk of the Town of Palmyra, in accordance with the requirements of Article 12-A of the Town Law.

On January 19, 1998, an Order was adopted by the Town Board reciting the filing of the map, plan and report, the boundaries of the proposed extension to the Cen ral Water District, the improvements proposed, the estlmated expense of these improvements the proposed method of financing, the fact that the map, plan and report rt are on file in the Town Clerk's Office for public inspection and all other matters required by law to be stated.

The Order set February 12, 1998, at 8:00 PM at the Town Clerk's Office, 201 East Main Street Palmyra, NY to consider the map, plan and rep rt and to hear all persons interested in this matter and to take action as required by law.

A hearing on the matter was held by the Town Board on February 12, 1998, at 8:00 PM and the matter was fully discussed and all interested persons were heard.

Upon evidence given at the hearing and upon a motion made and seconded, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

It is hereby determined that:

- A. The notice of hearing was published and posted as required by law, and is otherwise sufficient.
- B. All the property and property owners within the proposed extension district are benefited thereby.
- C. All the property and property owners benefited are included within the limits of the proposed extension district.
- D. The establishment of this extension district is in the public interest.
- E. That the proposed extension district is outside of the Village of Palmyra and any existing district.
- IT IS FURTHER DETERMINED AND RESOLVED, that the extension district, as set forth in the map, plan and report be approved, that the requested improvement be constructed, and that the necessary easements and lands be acquired, upon the required funds being made available and provided for.
- IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that this district shall be known as the Extension No. 3 of the Central Water District in the Town of Palmyra and shall be bounded and described as follows:

ALL THAT TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND, situate on the north side of North Creek Road in the Town of Palmyra, County of Wayne and State of New York, bounded and described as follows:

COMMENCING at the intersection of the north line of the Central Water District with the east line of premises now owned by Daniel Pedtke and Mary Bolton, bearing tax account no. 33111-00-556901; thence 1) northerly along the east line of said parcel to the northeast corner of said parcel; thence 2) westerly along the north line of said parcel and parcel with tax map no. 33111-00-501913 and parcel with tax map no. 33111-00-446963, to the northwest corner of said parcel bearing tax map no. 33111-00-446963; thence 3) southerly along the west line of the last aforesaid tax par parcel to its intersection with the north line of the Central Water District; thence 4) easterly along the north line of the Central Water District to the point and place of beginning.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that the construction of the proposed improvements for the district, consisting of a water system, including water mains, distribution pipes, hydrants, reservoirs, and including a proposed plan of purchase of water from the Wayne County Water and Sewer Authority, and including the purchase of the assets, if any, which presently operates a water system within a portion o f the proposed district, and also including land or rights in land, original furnishing, equipment, machinery or apparatus incidental thereto, substantially as set forth on the map, plan and report to, it hereby authorized as a maximum estimated cost of \$0; and

Central Water District, the properties in Extension No. 3 of the Central Water District shall pay any and all charges with the same ad valorem rates as in the Central Water District, together with the same fees for connection, hookup, use of water and maintenance of the system; and

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk shall cause to be published and posted in the Town, a notice that the above resolution was adopted pursuant to a permissive referendum as provided in Article 12-A of the Town Law in the manner provided in Article 7 of the Town Law, and

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that in the event a petition is not received as required by law requiring a referendum, the Town Clerk shall prepare a certificate ''that petition was not received" suitable for filing with the County and Town, and

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVEDJ that the Clerk shall file a certified copy of the Order creating the Extension District within 10 days of creation of the Extension District with the Wayne County Clerk.
