# **Buildings and Grounds Committee – Ken Miller, Chairman**

MTN: APPROVE EXCAVATION PERMIT FOR DIVISION ST.

NYSEG Excavation Permit: NYSEG submitted an application for permission to excavate two 4' x 4' openings off of the pavement and to punch the road for the purpose of installing a new 2" mp-poly gas service that will serve Willow Landings Subdivision, Divison Street in Palmyra. In order to proceed with the excavation, they needed board approval and the Supervisor's signature. Mike Lambrix made the motion to allow NYSEG to proceed with this excavation.

TOWN BOARD DECLINES BEING LEAD AGENCY FOR GARLOCK RENOVATIONS

- 1. Resolution: Declare Town Board lead agency for Garlock Sealing Technologies renovations: The Town had received a SEQR application from Garlock Sealing Technologies for planned renovations to the plant, as well as for installation of the sewer lines from Division Street to the plant. The thought was that the Town Board would declare itself lead agency for the project. After considering the scope of the request, it was decided by board members not to pursue the lead agency status. No motion was offered.
- 2. Resolution—New Town Hall sign: The following resolution was considered to accept the gift of a new sign in front of the Palmyra Town Hall:

RESOLUTION TO ACCEPT GIFT OF NEW PALMYRA TOWN HALL SIGN

MTN: APPROVE RESOLUTION TO ACCEPT TOWN HALL SIGN AS GIFT & THANK KEN MILLER FOR COORDINATING PROJECT PROPOSED AD IN THE CANAL CRUISING GUIDE FOR 2006-2007 3. Canal Cruising Guide ad: Every other year, a Canal Cruising Guide is published specifically for boaters along the Erie, Champlain, Oswego and Cayuga-Seneca canals in the NY State Canal System. The third edition is about to be published and Palmyra had received notification that if we wish to purchase an ad in the Guide, as we have done in the previous two editions, the new prices for ads would apply. Lynne Green and Mayor Vicky Daly had been approached by a representative of the LDS Church, offering to pay for a third of the ad, with each of the other municipalities contributing a third each. What was proposed was a half-page ad, in color, which costs \$750. Each would contribute \$250. In the last two editions, the town and village had split the \$385 cost of a quarter-page ad, in two colors.

Discussion ensued about concerns that the town marginally benefits from canal travelers, and the issue of collaboration with the LDS Church for tourism promotion. Since the smallest ad in this year's *Cruising Guide* is one-third page, it was decided that the most the board would be willing to consider is a one-third page, black-and-white ad, with the town sharing half of the \$425 cost with the village. Since there was no cost in re-using the previous *Guide's* ad design, and since it had an "old-fashioned" feel about it, the previous ad was deemed acceptable for this year's *Guide*. Lynne Green was to go back to the village and explain the town's position, and the cost parameters board members had outlined.

4. At 8:22 p.m., Dave Lyon asked that board members stay for an Executive Session to discuss matters of personnel. Dave Nussbaumer made the motion to enter Executive Session.

Second: Mike Lambrix Vote: 4 ayes. Carried.

At 8:47 p.m., Supervisor Lyon declared the board out of Executive Session.
