Supervisor Lyon asked for any comments concerning this possible increase in contract amounts.

John Pieters, Chief of the East Palmyra Fire Department, told those present that the department would like to have a three year contract with increases of 10%, 12% and 14% inclusive.

Roy Wilck, Firefighter, stated that he has spent six

Saturdays this year working on fund raisers and there are only a certain few that help to do this. However, there are 250 people ready to call 911 when they need help and they are only paying a small fire tax. He said he personally would not care if the fire tax were doubled. He feels that the time spent on fund raising could be put to better use by spending that time on training.

Dan Gardner, President of the East Palmyra Fire

Department, said that the fire tax is a small price to pay for the protection the people get. They are now handling medical calls as well as fire calls and the training for the medical people and the supplies is an additional expense for the department. He does not feel that the taxpayers would mind an increase in the fire tax. He feels that a lot is being asked of the members and that members are beginning to drop out because of this.

Frank Gorall, oldest firefighter in service, said that he seems to be spending more and more time at the fire hall working on the fund raisers. He said they have to have the fund raisers or they will go under; therefore, any help will be appreciated.

Sue Hartman, medical squad, agrees with

what everyone has said and being on the rescue squad sees a increase of rescue calls. You need to have the right equipment to help your people and therefore, does not feel a increase in rates would be out of line.

Casey McGee – He is both a line firefighter and on the rescue squad – There is a need for more training and that causes more expense. He would very much appreciate a increase.

Doris Wolf, Courier-Journal, asked how much the annual budget is. John Pieters, Fire Chief, told her it is around \$45,000.00

Supervisor Lyon asked for any more comments or questions. There being none, he declared this public hearing closed at 8:15 PM.

Gibson Fire Department was in attendance. There was no one.
Supervisor Lyon asked for any comments or questions regarding

this contract. There were none. Supervisor Lyon declared this public hearing closed at 8:17 PM.

PUBLIC HEARING JAMES MILLER PROPOSED CAMP GROUNDS

The public hearing scheduled to be held on Thursday,

October 28, 1999 at the East Palmyra Fire Hall, East Palmyra, to
consider the application of James R. Miller, 31 Catherine Street,
Lyons, NY, to operate a camp ground with approximately 50
camp sites on property located at 4227 North Creek Road,
Palmyra, was called to order at 8:30 PM by Town Supervisor

David C. Lyon.

Those in attendance were the same as the first public hearing this evening.

The legal notice, as published in the Courier-Journal, was read by the Town Celrk.

Supervisor Lyon asked Mr. Miller to describe what he would like to do. Mr. Miller stated that his idea is to have campsites plus preserving green sites. He has about 51 acres of which maybe 8 acres could be plowed if it was cleared. He believes this is a good use for his property and it would also be good for the community. He feels the entrance might be a problem so he is going to change the location of same. He plans on good sized area for each site and he does not want RV's in there; only tents and pop-ups. The state has told him that he has room for 666 sites but he does not want that big of a camp ground.

Supervisor Lyon then asked for comments or questions from those present. Sue Hartman said that this is a gorgeous

area but she has some concerns: 1. - Noise; this is a valley and it does echo 2. Traffic; the roads will have to be maintained better due to the increased traffic. 3. Litter; The fishing and canoeing will draw people. Along with fishing comes litter and that can be a problem. There are already tires full of water, appliances have been dumped; this is probably the biggest problem. She has already had a big vet bill due to the dumping. Supervisor Lyon commented that traffic and litter is a big problem all over the town and we can not expect these people to be responsible for it.

Supervisor Lyon asked Mr. Miller to address the noise issue. Mr. Miller said that he does not want a big party place out there. He said that his own house will be on the front 4 acres and he can hear enough motorcycles, trains and parties from the Bridge Pub area.

Stan Starkenburg stated that you cannot preserve green space by putting 200 people in a small area. He said there will be a decrease in wildlife in the area and the campfires will create smoke. A lot of people adjoin this property and a lot of us like to hike. Mr. Miller – as far as pollution, there will be campfires; the swamp area is protected by the DEC; wildlife may be lost due to harvesting of lumber; as for hikers trespassing, a fence will be provided along the property and the guests will be advised not to go over said fence.

Mr. Miller stated that the first year he would like to have 20 camp sites, and then if successful another 20 the second year with the final 10 the third year.

Robert Grier, CEO, told Mr. Miller that if approval is given on this project, a SEQR will be necessary before going to the Planning Board.

Curt Cowell said that he has the same concerns as everybody else but the driveway will scare him no matter where it is placed. He is also concerned about the septic and the waste water. Mr. Miller – The septic system will be put in according to the guidelines of the Town of Palmyra and as for the roadway, the site distance is a requirement of the state.

Rose Ranny – The drainage ditch along the property; if that is closed up her property will be flooded. A beaver dam is holding water up right now. Miller – as for the drainage ditch, that is were property got it's name "Brook Valley." He stated that there are actually three dams there and he believes that opening up the ditch will help.

Bob Hannah – Built his retirement home out there to enjoy watching the birds and turkeys; does not seen like they will stay around with all these extra people added to the landscape. He is worried about the noise. Are you going to allow alcohol out there? Miller – Has not addressed alcohol that at this point; will probably let the attorneys and lawyers decide that.

Wendi Rockefeller - Has a number of concerns; noise is a problem (we will be subjected to listening to this year round); fires and smoke; will lose the peaceful setting of the county; and adding campsites will drive wildlife away.

Greg Watkins – 50 cars per day will upset my dogs; increased shots heard by the RR already; camping will pull in skunks and raccoons, etc.; litter and people all over my property; increased accidents; 3 houses have been added to the road in the last year; has a lot of concerns about this project.

Dan Gardner – He has a similar project about 8 years ago; definitely needed in our area; the Millers seen like nice people; you could be inviting the wrong kind of use if you stop this use.

Michelle Durfee – Has already heard people walking up and down the road at 3:30 AM and campers have teenagers; there will be a lot more cars.

At this time the following letter from Jack Haight was read into these minutes:

October 27, 1999

Board of Supervisors Town of Palmyra E. Main Street Palmyra, NY 14522

To the Town Board:

First I would like to explain that if I had been notified in time, I would have been at this meeting. However I have a meeting that I scheduled with five organizations that I cannot back out of at this late date. I found out about this meeting on Monday, October 25, 1999 and verified it with the Town Clerk yesterday. I live about 200 yards from the land that the owner is seeking a variance for a campground. I had to hear about the meeting from a friend that was notified on Route 21. I guess that I live too far away. How many more of my neighbors have not been notified?

I want to say that I am very much against having a campground just over the next hill. Twenty-five years ago I left Inner City Rochester to have piece and quiet. I liked my location here as I could pick up my shotgun and walk across the road and up Hand's hill or go back of my house and go deer hunting. Those days are now a thing of the past. Bit by bit new houses have built were I once could hunt. And now you are considering a campground. What about the roads and the possible pollution of our wells? Remember, you "would not have water run up our road as there are not enough houses." I have camped at campgrounds many times and they usually have bands on Friday and Saturday nights. There goes my piece and quiet. And a business right around the corner. It is starting to sound a lot like down town Rochester.

I really don't believe this letter will affect the Boards decision. After all, one of the Family of a board member has been logging the land all summer and fall.

At its regular meeting on September 29, 1999 the Wayne county Planning Board reviewed the above referenced referral and recommended Denial of the request for a special permit as the board wanted more site plan information. The board was very concerned about the apparent lack of site distance available at the current road cut. The board wondered if there is potential to access the parcel from another area that would offer greater site distances. The board also wanted clarification regarding the utilities. Will every site have water and electric "hook up"? The board felt if site-wide utilities are proposed, the referral would best be handled as a permanent use variance rather than a renewable special permit.

Excerpt from the Town of Palmyra Planning Board minutes of October 11, 1999:

Item #\1: Miller; North Creek Road Campsite.

L. Edinger asked Mr. Miller to explain his proposal. Mr. Miller stated that he wanted to build a camping facility, with 55 sites, for tents and pop-up campers. There won't be any facilities for RV's. There will not be electric at all sites, water stations through out the area and one bathhouse facility. The campsites will be located on 51 acres of land. The site will be open from the beginning of May thru October. L. Kaller asked if the existing driveway would be used or would it be moved? Mr. Miller said that he would like to keep using the existing driveway because he would have to cross a creek if it were moved. He thought that the site distance was at least 500' and that the driveway has been used for years and there has never been a problem.

MOTION: B. Baker made a motion to recommend approval of the Special Permit for a Camp Site at 4227 North Creek Road with the stipulation that if the Town Board grant the Special Permit. Mr. Miller returns to the Planning Board, with detailed site plan prepared by an engineer licensed land surveyor, for final site plan approval.

2nd: K. Miller VOTE: Unanimous

Mr. Miller said that the driveway will definitely be changed.

Supervisor Lyon asked for any more comments or question regarding this proposed campsite. There being none, he declared this public hearing closed at 9:15 PM.

has out there. (The 500 indicates a variety of types of campers from tent campers to RVs)

Pete Holden – log home 250' off this property. He stated that Mr. Johnston and he knew the responsibility of being good neighbors. Does not anticipate any problems that cannot be worked out.

Michael Lambrix stated that he has walked this property and has seen other properties like this. He has a lot of confidence in Mr. Johnston and the way he has tastefully placed the burms. Things are not flashing at the public when you come down Rt. 31.

Robert Grier stated that increasing the driveway to 24' may need approval of the state.

Robert Grier had some questions to ask. Supervisor Lyon told him that was the type of thing that could be worked out in committee.

Supervisor Lyon then asked if there were any more comments or questions. There being none, he declared this public hearing closed at 9:55 PM.
