January 12, 1961

The regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra held on Thursday, January 12, 1961, at 8:00 p.m., at the Town Clerk's Office was called to order by Supervisor Mate.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read. Mr. O'Meal moved they be approved as read, seconded by Mr. Baran, Ayes 3, nos 0. Carried.

Mr. Baran moved the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 164 of the Social Welfare Law, the Village of Palmyra has heretofore established a Home Relief Work Project to consist of cleaning, clearing and removing obstructions, brush and trees from the Palmyra Cemetery lands, and the Town Board of the said Town directed that employable persons in receipt of Home Relief be assigned to perform such work for the Village of Palmyra when the Village should request such assignment, and

WHEREAS, heretofore and on the third day of January 1961, the said Village established two additional Home Relief Projects as follows:

- "1. Cleaning, sweeping and general repair to the Village Hall.
2. General maintenance of the public highways.

"NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

"(1) That the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra hereby determines and directs that employable persons in receipt of Home Relief shall be assigned to perform work for the Village of Palmyra when the Village shall request such assignment as follows:

- (1) Cleaning, sweeping and general repair to the Village Hall.
- (2) General maintenance of the public highways.

"That the request for assignment of workers shall be directed to the Town Welfare Officer and must indicate the number of persons who can be used and the character of the work to be performed."

Mr. O'Meal moved that W. Ray Converse be appointed town Attorney for the Town of Palmyra for the year 1961. Seconded by Mr. Baran Ayes 3, nos 0. Carried.

He also stated that considerable correspondence has taken place in regard to Route 31 and Hammond Road Water District, but since no state lands can be included petition will not be ready till the correct boundaries can be established.

Supervisor reported that he had met with the Chairman of the Town Planning Board and also with the Chairman of the Village Planning Board and Village Mayor and stated that a letter has been sent to Hallister Kent, Consultant, regarding the purchase of his plan, not as a whole, but as it is needed by the Town of Palmyra.

WHEREAS, a written petition dated February 26, 1961, in due form and containing the required signatures, has been presented to and filed with the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, for the establishment of the Division Street Water District in said town to be bounded and described as follows:

ALL THAT TRACT OR PARCELS OF LAND situate in the Town of Palmyra, County of Wayne and State of New York, and bounded and described as follows, viz: Beginning at an angle point in the Maple Avenue Water District, said point being the intersection of the north highway line of Walton Road and a line parallel with the centerline of Maple Avenue and 500 feet easterly therefrom; thence northerly along the east boundary of the Maple Avenue Water District to a point formed by the intersection of a line drawn at right angles to the centerline of Division Street 1398 feet north from the centerline of the New York Central Railroad crossing of Division Street just north of Walton Road; and measured along the centerline of Division Street and the east boundary of the Maple Avenue Water District; thence easterly along a line perpendicular to the centerline of Division Street, said line being 1398 feet north from the centerline of the New York Central Railroad crossing of Division Street just north of Walton Road; and measured along the centerline of Division Street to the centerline of Red Creek; thence southerly, westerly, southerly, and easterly along the centerline of Red Creek to a point formed by the intersection of the centerline of Red Creek and a line parallel with the centerline of Division Street and 500 feet easterly therefrom; measured at right angles to the centerline; thence southerly along a line parallel with the centerline of Division Street and 500 feet easterly therefrom to the north boundary of the Village of Palmyra; thence westerly along the north boundary of the Village of Palmyra to the easternmost boundary of the Maple Avenue Water District; thence northerly along said easternmost boundary of the Maple Avenue Water District to an angle point in the Maple Avenue Water District; thence westerly along the north highway line of Walton Road, said line also being a boundary of the Maple Avenue Water District to the point of beginning.

AND WHEREAS, the improvement proposed consists of the formation of a Water District in the territory above described, to be known as the Division Street Water District, the supply of water to

day of the Maple Avenue Water District in a point formed by the intersection of the centerline of Division Street and the east boundary of the Maple Avenue Water District, thence easterly along a line perpendicular to the centerline of Division Street, said line being 898 feet north from the centerline of the New York Central Railroad crossing of Division Street just north of Walton Road and measured along the centerline of Division Street to the centerline of Red Creek, thence southerly, westerly, southerly and easterly along the centerline of Red Creek to a point formed by the intersection of the centerline of Red Creek and a line parallel with the centerline of Division Street and 500 feet easterly therefrom, measured at right angles to the centerline, thence southerly along a line parallel with the centerline of Division Street and 500 feet easterly therefrom, measured at right angles to the centerline of Red Creek, thence westerly along the north boundary of the Village of Palmyra to the easternmost boundary of the Maple Avenue Water District, thence northerly along said easternmost boundary of the Maple Avenue Water District to a point in the Maple Avenue Water District, thence westerly along the north highway line of Walton Road, said line also being a boundary of the Maple Avenue Water District, to the point of beginning.

AND WHEREAS the improvement proposed consists of the formation of a Water District in the territory above described to be known as the Division Street Water District; the supply of water to be purchased from the Village of Palmyra and to be furnished and connected to the existing main at the north boundary of said village.

AND WHEREAS the maximum amount proposed to be expended for the extension of said District as stated in the said petition is the sum of Nine thousand dollars (\$9000.00); it is hereby

ORDERED, that a meeting of the Town Board of the said Town of Palmyra shall be held at the Justice Room in the Village Hall on the south side of East Main Street, in the Village of Palmyra, New York, on the 11th day of May 1961, at 8:00 o'clock in the evening of that day to consider the said petition and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof, concerning the same and for such other action on the part of said Town Board with relation to said premises as may be required by law and is proper in the premises.

SUGGESTED REQUIREMENTS FOR HIGHWAY
CONSTRUCTION BY DEVELOPERS OF TRACTS AND SUBDIVISIONS

All plans for developments shall be submitted to Town Board for approval before any work begins.

Plan shall be submitted to whichever highway superintendent or engineer, whose highway subdivision street will intersect, for permission to intersect.

Plan shall be prepared by a registered engineer, surveyor, or site planner, showing existing features of land and proposed street and lot layout.

All streets and roads shall have right of way of not less than $49\frac{1}{2}$ feet (3 rods), 60 feet (4 rods) shall be required if tract is to have sidewalk either at present or in future.

Grades of all streets shall generally conform to terrain. Street grade shall be not less than 0.5% nor more than 7%.

Street shall have a minimum of 18 inches of suitable bank run base gravel, compacted in 6 inch lifts, plus a 6 inch top course of suitable gravel, crushed to approximately 2 inches and compacted.

For Dolomite stone type of street construction: Bottom course shall be a minimum total of 12 inches of #3 type stone placed in 2 or more lifts. Each lift rolled and chinked. Top course shall be plant mix asphaltic concrete binder course compacted to 2" with one inch compacted sheet asphaltic concrete finish course on top.

Aforesaid gravel and stone street constructions shall have a minimum width of 24 feet. Crown to be figured at one inch to every four feet of width. Example: 6" crown for a 24' road.

Shoulders shall be a minimum of 6 feet on each side; preferable gravel coated.

Minimum width of paved surface shall be 20 feet.

Highway gutters shall be at least 12" below center of finished highway grade on 3 rod rights of way, with no sidewalk, shall be cut approximately 2 feet in from lot lines.

Adequate facilities for storm and surface water disposal should be provided, bearing in mind that when the natural terrain is disturbed there is usually a greater concentration of surface water at certain points than there would be on the original land.

Easement for the drainage of highway waters onto and across private properties shall be provided for in the dedication of the highway.

Driveway culverts shall be of corrugated metal pipe type, and shall be furnished by the builder or home owner. Installation shall be done in such a way as to permit adequate flow towards disposal point. Minimum culvert diameter of 8 inches will be acceptable only if run-off conditions warrant. Larger diameters will be required where severe water conditions might exist.

All underground utilities should be installed before street is brought to final grade.

Entire highway right of way should be on grade according to rules and regulations before any permanent structure is started.

Intersections shall be approached on all sides by levelling areas. Where the grade exceed seven (7%) percent, such levelling areas shall have a minimum length of fifty (50) feet within which no grade shall exceed a maximum of four percent. The grade of actual intersections shall not exceed two percent in any direction.

Foregoing requirements may be varied to fit individual situations.

Mr. Pierce again present at the meeting.

Mr. DeBrins, Highway Superintendent, recommended the acceptance of the second five hundred feet of highway on Meadow Drive, as he believes it to be now in proper condition for accepting

The map above referred to is a map or plan prepared by Harnish & Lookup, entitled "Plan of Section 1 Fairlawn Subdivision Developed By Lloyd Haak and Wayne R. Williamson" and is dated September 11, 1959. Said proposed town highway runs through the lands of the Said Lloyd J. Haak and Wayne R. Williamson.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved, that in accordance with the provisions of Section 171 of the Highway Law of the State of New York, consent be and the same hereby is given that the Town Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Palmyra make an order laying out the aforesaid town highway, the said town highway to consist of the lands described in the said dedication and release and to extend as delineated upon the map thereto annexed. And it is further

Resolved, that the Town Clerk be and she is hereby directed to forthwith cause such release to be recorded in the Office of the Clerk of the County of Wayne and upon its return to attach it hereto.

The VanScott proposed subdivision creates still another problem. This 12" main will only service 1000' west of Maple Avenue. For further expansion of this tract, it will be necessary to install a stand pipe. This will completely satisfy that entire tract, even to the Harris farm if that should ever be considered. He estimated the cost of the Stand pipe at \$25,000. The only other alternative to take care of this tract would be the connection of the 6" line on Division Street with the 6" line on Maple Avenue.

It was the opinion of Mr. Wilson, Attorney for VanScott Bros., why go thru the expense of this \$11,500 line now which will only satisfy 1000' West of Maple Avenue when for \$25,000 the entire tract could be adequately taken care for future development.

He asked that he might review the matter with the land owner as well as with his clients before any decision is made and that he would have some answer for the Board by the 28th day of July.

At this time, Mr. Woodward, Engineer, appeared before the Board and explained the problem that now faces the Maple Avenue Water District regarding the installation of the pipe across the Canal bridge.

He went on to say that on June 27, he went to Syracuse and the details of this project were discussed with Mr. L.E. Burns, Head of the Department and he was told that when the Town was ready to put this under contract, and application for a permit would receive favorable consideration. He was given the blanks at this time on which to make this application as it was felt that there would be no problem with the Maple Avenue Bridge, that they would accept the application of the town for a permit to place a 12" water main on the Maple Avenue Bridge. Plans and specifications were then prepared and application was sent in. On November 21 application for the permit was denied. The reason being the the pipe line would add a load of 8 to 10 tons and this bridge was never designed to carry this. But they would consider a proposal for running the pipe under the canal at a depth of at least 17 feet.

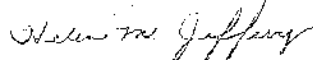
