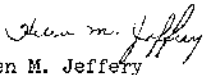

The regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra held on Thursday, February 11, 1965, at 7:30 p.m., at the Town Clerk's Office was called to order by Supervisor Van den Bout.

Mr. Baran moved that the reading of the minutes be dispensed with. Seconded by Mr. O'Meal. Ayes 4, nos 0. Carried.

Mr. John Rolland along with counsel Robert Teamerson appeared before the Board in reference to the acceptance by the Town of the development which he has planned out Canandaigua Road. The Town Board impressed upon Mr. Rolland that it would be necessary for him to provide proper drainage, including an easement or easements, for the disposition of the water. It was further noted that a "T" might be considered instead of a cul-da-sac at the east end of the development provided that a suitable highway was constructed from the final lot of the subdivision to the proposed "T" which runs north and south.

It was suggested that the additions were to be included in the revised map of the subdivision and when completely in accord with the above provisions of the subdivision and upon exhibiting plans embodying above, conditional approval would be granted and final approval only when completely complied with.

Mr. Leon Rider appeared before the Board regarding an extension of the Canandaigua Road Water District.

Counselor explained to Mr. Rider that application for permission to extend the Canandaigua Road Water District in 1960 was denied but was denied without prejudice to any future application in this matter and possibly, if more assessment could be shown, they might change their minds. Mr. Converse suggested that he have the property that he has an option on laid out and mapped out by an engineer and submit this along with a petition.

It appeared that the Town had paid for a typewriter furnished by Underwood Corp. which was not of a kind wanted by the clerk and after many months the proper typewriter had not been delivered.

RESOLVED that Council for the Town start legal action to recover payment of \$257 made by the Town.

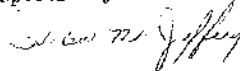

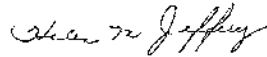

Dear Sir:

This is in reply to your letter of December 1, 1965, in which you inquire concerning the qualifications for office on the part of the woman who was elected tax collector of your town at the recent general election. In view of your request that our answer be forthcoming in time for your December 9 town board meeting, we are replying at once.

Specifically, your problem centers around the fact that the woman in question was not the record owner of real property in the town at the time of her election. You are satisfied that the election was a nullity and that she is not eligible to take office, because of the requirement contained in section 23 of the Town Law that "every elective officer of the town at the time of his election and throughout his term of office, shall be an elector of the town and shall be the owner of record of real property in the town."

You state that you are also aware that the office of town collector is now vacant. Technically, this is true, because, under section 24 of the Town Law, the tax collector takes office "immediately after his election upon qualifying as prescribed by law." Of course, if the prior incumbent of the collector's office is currently holding over and performing duties as collector, there is authority for this under section 5 of the Public Officers Law, although the office is deemed vacant for the purposes of appointing a successor, who, upon being appointed and qualifying, will immediately take office.

Your actual questions concern the duration of the appointment. You ask:

1. Is the appointment to fill the vacancy good until December 31, 1966, or only until next year's general election?
2. Must the appointee run again in next year's election?
1. Since the term of office of tax collector commences immediately

after his election upon qualifying as prescribed by law (Town Law, Section 24) it follows that the appointment would be good only until the newly elected tax collector qualifies following his election. This is borne out by the pertinent provisions of section 64 (5) of the Town Law, which state:

"If the appointment be made to fill a vacancy in the office of collector or justice of the peace, the person so appointed shall hold office until the next annual election at which the vacancy may be filled."

In connection with the appointment, we think we should point out that, where an appointment is being made to fill a vacancy in an elective office, the appoint must qualify by being a record owner of real property in the town in the same fashion as if he were running for the office in an election. That is, he must be a record owner at the time of his appointment (8 Op. State Compt. 125,1952; 3 Op. State Compt. 92, 1947).

2. Since the appointment is good only until the next election, as aforesaid, it follows that, if the appointee desires the office beyond that date, he would have to seek it in the said next election.

We trust that the above will be of assistance to you.

Report of Town Historian - 1965

After appointment in March, material came from the State Department on the Historian's duties and the list of departments that can be used as a source of historical information.

April 23 - call from Dorothy Facer regarding historical work and to make and appointment to see me.

April 26 - Mildred Taylor and Dorothy Facer spent two hours with me discussing historical places in Palmyra. The State want more information on some of the places in Wayne County and Mildred Taylor has been doing this. Mrs. Taylor is working on the Pliny Sexton property. Upon completion of that, she is to do research of the Fair Grounds. Mrs. Facer left material on our small abandoned cemeteries located in the Town of Palmyra. October 29 - Historical material returned to Dorothy Facer.

November 6 - Dorothy Facer planned an auction that was held at the Lyons Community Center. Auctioneers in the area gave their services and members of the Historical Society contributed many items. The auction was a great success. The amount raised was \$646.00 and this will be used to buy a rug for the lounge and make repairs to the windows in the barn.

During the summer months I had correspondence from several people interested in visiting Palmyra, wanting to know places to visit. (historical) Also several letters wanting records of relatives.

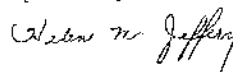
