The Wayne County Home Meals Service, aka Meals-on-Wheels delivered more than 43,000 meals to 320 individuals last year. There are currently about 250 volunteers, but more are needed and would be very welcome. There are 2 routes in Palmyra – Towpath which takes about 15 minutes tops and the Palmyra Town Route which requires an hour or slightly more. If you can spare that amount of time, even once a month, call 315-946-5623. You will find delivering meals a pleasant and rewarding experience.
