As you probably already know, *Curling on the Canal 2011* had to be cancelled. Who would have thought in one of the coldest Januarys ever that we would have to cancel in February because of unseasonably warm temperatures? Unlike most areas along the canal, Palmyra has water year round and so under the ice there is 8 feet of very cold water. We just could not take the chance of having someone fall through. In the meantime, there are many things going on right now and scheduled for early spring, so mark your calendars and think sunshine and warm.

Ongoing Palmyra events include the 1st Saturday of the month steak dinners at the Palmyra American Legion; the Kings Daughters Library Luncheon on the 2nd Monday, and the Fire Department's pancake breakfast on the 4th Sunday (but not in March this year). Each of these is advertised individually so watch for details. Information about the Palmyra VFW's chicken parm dinner is noted on their sign so watch for them too.

Special one of a kind events are happening all the time. The Village Bookmarket in Palmyra, often in conjunction with Book, Etc. in Macedon, hosts speakers on a variety of topics. Watch for details and, if this is where your interests are, stop in and get on Marcia's email alert list. The same is true at Muddy Waters Café on the canal. Donna hosts both speakers and musicians. Watch for them also. Special events happen, too, at the American Legion. That information, like the VFW's, appears on their sign and details about concerts at Lock 29 can be found on the signboard in front of the tavern. Canal Town Chorale and special musical events at the churches should be watched for, too. There really is something for everyone.
