The regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra, held on Thursday, January 12, 1956, at 3:00 p.m. at the town clerk's office was called to order by Supervisor Mate.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read. Mr. Pierce, moved they be accepted as read, seconded by Mr. O'Meal. Carried. Ayes 4, Noos 0.

Town Attorney Mr. Pierce moved the appointment of Earl W. Tabor as Town Attorney for the Town of Palmyra, for the year 1956, seconded by Mr. O'Meal. Carried. Ayes 4, noos 0.

Town Historian Mr. Baran moved the appointment of Mary C. Johnson as Town Historian for the Town of Palmyra for the year 1956. Seconded by Mr. Pierce, carried. ayes 4, noos 0.

Chairman of Board of Assessors Mr. O'Meal moved the appointment of John VanHall as Chairman of the Board of Assessors for year 1956, seconded by Mr. Baran. Carried, Ayes 4, Noos 0.

Constables Mr. Pierce moved the appointment of Francis Toole and Roy Fullman as town constables of the Town of Palmyra for the year 1956 and that in lieu of salary they retain for services rendered the statutory fee of \$1.50 plus mileage at 15¢ per mile, seconded by Mr. O'Meal. Carried. Ayes 4, Noos 0.

Dog Warden Mr. Baran moved the appointment of Dr. William Buell, Vet., as Dog Warden for the year 1956 and that he be paid fees of \$1.00 for seizure and \$1.00 for disposal of each dog and 50 cents for board of each dog for maximum of 5 days, seconded by Mr. Pierce, Carried, Ayes 4, noos 0.

At this time Henry B. Nesbitt, Justice of the Peace arrived at the board meeting.

Clerk advised the Board that she would like to have Harold Jeffery and Harry E. Young as deputy town clerks for year 1956.

Mr. O'Meal moved that Harold Jeffery be appointed as deputy town clerk with all powers of the town clerk and that Harry E. Young be limited to that of issuing conservation and dog licenses only and that Mr. Young be compensated \$6.00 for each day of work in this office not to exceed the amount in budget. Seconded by Mr. Pierce, Carried, Ayes 5, noo 0.

Mr. Baran moved that the town officers be paid 8 cents per mile for use of their automobile for each mile actually and necessarily traveled by them in the performance of their duties of their office. Seconded by Mr. O'Meal Carried, ayes 5, noos 0.

Mr. Nesbitt moved that the salaries of the elective and appointive officer be as follows: Supervisor \$2500.00, Justices 9 \$1,000.00 each, Councilmen - \$300.00 each, Town Clerk - \$2700, Highway Superintendent \$5000.00, Assessors-\$850 for chairman, \$600 for each of the other two, Welfare Officer

\$1700.00, Town Historian - \$200.00, Tax Collector - \$200.00, Town Attorney - \$500.00, Registrar - \$100.00, seconded by Mr. Baran. Carried. Ayes 5, Noos 0.

Mr. Pierce moved that the official paper for the Town of Palmyra for 1956 be designated as the Palmyra Courier Co., Inc. Seconded by Mr. O'Meal. Carried. Ayes 5, noos 0.

Mr. Nesbitt moved that the Election Inspectors be paid \$15.00 for Election and 1st Registration Day and \$12.00 for 2nd Registration and Primary Day, seconded by Mr. O'Meal. Carried. Ayes 5, Noos 0.

At this time Mr. Pierce was excused from the meeting.

Mr. Baran moved that the purchase price of gravel be 15¢ per yard for bank-run gravel purchased within the town. Seconded by Mr. Nesbitt. Carried. Ayes 4, Noos 0.

Mr. Nesbitt moved the appointment of Helen M. Jeffery as Registrar of Vital Statistics for a two year term, seconded by Mr. Baran. Carried. Ayes 4, noos 0. Harold E. Jeffery as Deputy Registrar.

Mr. O'Meal moved that the bonds of Francis Toole and Roy Pullman be approved, seconded by Mr. Baran. Carried. Ayes 4, Noos 0.

Mr. Nesbitt moved that Sherwood W. Mate be designated as the delegate for the Town of Palmyra at the Association of Town Meeting and James DeErine as the alternate. Seconded by Mr. O'Meal. Carried Ayes 4, Noos 0.

Mr. Nesbitt moved that the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra hold its regular board meetings on the 2nd Thursday of each month at 3:00 p.m. Seconded by Mr. O'Meal. Carried. Ayes 4, Noos 0.

An hourly increase for the highway men was discussed. Mr. Nesbitt moved that the discussion be tabled and be taken up at our next regular meeting. Seconded by Mr. Baran. Carried. Ayes 4, Noos 0.

Mr. Baran moved that our next regular board meeting be held February 16th instead of February 9, 1956. Seconded by Mr. Nesbitt. Carried.
